He joined the Maple Inn APA Pool League and played on several teams. He loved pool but enjoyed the friendships made even more. His team, 2 Balls Blue, will be in the June regionals... Brandon will be with them in spirit. He has participated in the Red Corner Benefit to support a child with cancer for the past several years. He loved the outdoors and camping, the Philadelphia Folk Festival, and concerts. He loved music, especially old country, The Grateful Dead, and Bob Marley among others. 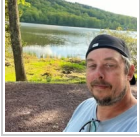
