



## Carl S. Uehlinger

Carl S. Uehlinger died peacefully on Monday, July 4, 2022, at Lehigh Valley Hospital – Cedar Crest at the age of 82. He was the loving husband of Margaret (Spence) Uehlinger for 59 wonderful years.

Born December 20, 1939, in Rockville Centre, NY, he grew up in Patchogue, NY and was the son of the late Carl and Martha (Meyer) Uehlinger.

Carl honorably served in the United States Army as an MP stationed in Germany. Upon returning to Long Island, he served for 24 years in the Suffolk County Police Dept in Highway Patrol as a motorcycle policeman as well as a firearms instructor, and later as a sergeant in charge of the SC Auxiliary Police. He retired in 1985 and in 2000 moved to Mertztown with his wife Margaret.

Carl enjoyed many hobbies including reading, especially WWII history; golf; fly fishing; playing guitar; and riding any one of his six antique BMW motorcycles.

He was married to Margaret Spence from Patchogue, NY on August 22, 1962.

Surviving with his wife are his children, Scott Uehlinger (Veronica) of Topton and Wendy Servedio (Charles) of Melbourne, FL; grandchildren, Carla, Michelle, Sophia, and Mihaela; sister, Cheryl Martell (Brian) of Yaphank, NY.
